Brand New Book ***** Print on Demand *****.This future research needs (FRN) report is a follow-up to the 2012 comparative effectiveness review (CER) Long-Term Care for Older Adults: A Review of Home and Community-Based Services Versus Institutional Care. The review was intended to support policy and research decisionmaking. FRN projects identify gaps in the current research that limit the conclusions in CERs and inform researchers and research funders about these gaps. They aim to encourage research likely to fill the gaps and make the body of evidence more useful to decisionmakers. The CER addressed the following two Key Questions targeting direct comparisons of long-term care (LTC) provided through home and community-based services (HCBS) and in nursing homes (NHs) to older adults aged 60 and older: Key Question 1: What are the benefits and harms of LTC provided through HCBS compared with institutions such as NHs for older adults, aged 60 and older, who need LTC? a. To what extent do HCBS and NHs serve similar populations? b. How do the outcomes of the services differ when tested on similar populations? c. What are the harms...



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
